

Christmas 2025 Costume Information for Set Apart 2C

For those of you who are new to Set Apart Girls this semester, I want to let you know first off that we do costuming a little differently than most dance studios. Our costumes are mostly re-usable to keep things easier and more cost effective! So, the costume items listed below will be the base items of your dancer's costume each performance, rather than just to use one time. We also have class-specific costume accessories that we will be adding on top when your dancer arrives on performance day.

Your dancer will need the following items for her COSTUME:

- A loose fitting, short-sleeved white T-shirt that provides good coverage in all ranges of movement. This should be plain white, with no sparkles or writing. No low V or scoop necks please!
- Light pink footed tights
- Pink ballet shoes
- Gold belt (this you will need to order from me)
- White satin drop waist skirt (this you will need to order from me as well)



To order your child's skirt and belt, simply text or email me to let me know which items your dancer needs (skirt, belt, or both), and how you would like to pay (cash, check, or PayPal). I am measuring your girls so I will know their sizes :) We will be making the skirts and belts for the girls, so please order as soon as possible so that we can have them made in time! Thank you!!

Costume Costs:

For satin drop waist skirt and gold belt: \$30

For belt only: \$8

For skirt only: \$25

HAIRSTYLE—This class hairstyle is going to be half-up-half-down, with curls! Please curl her hair and then pull the top half of her hair neatly back to a ponytail near the middle of her head.

MAKE-UP AND ACCESSORIES— No jewelry please, unless it's very small and discreet (like stud earrings). For make-up, we ask that you use it somewhat moderately, rather than heavy like a stage make-up job. Thank you so much!

For those of you who already have your girls' skirt and belt from previous semesters, **now is the time to check to make sure everything still fits your dancer!** Skirts should hit at least mid-calf, anything higher means your dancer needs a new skirt!
