


Christmas 2025 Costume Information for Set Apart 3A

For those of you who are new to Set Apart Girls this semester, I want to let you know first off that we do costuming a little differently than most dance studios. Our costumes are mostly re-usable to keep things easier and more cost effective! So, most of the costume items listed below will be the base items of your dancer's costume each performance, rather than just to use one time.

Your dancer will need the following items for her COSTUME:

- Pink ballet shoes
- Light pink (or skin color) dance tights
- White circle skirt and bloomers: this part of the costume you will need to order from me if your dancer does not already have one!
- A long-sleeved white leotard. This you can find online. I order mine from Discount Dance Supply, and I recommend the Theatricals or Capezio Women's Long Sleeve Dance Leotard. I also recommend going with a size larger than your dancer usually wears.

NOTE: Leotards should be considered as under-clothes, and should not be worn around the church without something over it (like a shirt and pants/skirt)! We will be putting dresses on over the leotards for their costume.



To order your dancer's skirt and bloomers, please just let me know via text or email what your dancer needs, and how you would like to pay (PayPal, cash or check)! I have already measured your girls, so I will know their sizes :) **The cost for circle skirt and bloomers together is \$42. Note: If you choose to pay with PayPal, it will be \$44 total.**

For those who already have a circle skirt from previous semesters, please check and make sure it still fits! It needs to reach at least mid-calf length. Let me know as soon as possible if your dancer needs a new skirt and bloomers!

HAIRSTYLE- Please pull your dancer's hair back in a secure, neat bun, quite low, near the nape of the neck. So, whatever supplies you need to make a bun, make sure you have those things on hand as well :)

MAKE-UP AND ACCESSORIES- No jewelry please, unless it's very small and discreet (like stud earrings). For make-up, we ask that you use it somewhat moderately, rather than heavy like a stage make-up job. Thank you so much!
