

Christmas 2025 Costume Information for Set Apart 3C

For those of you who are new to Set Apart Girls this semester, I want to let you know first off that we do costuming a little differently than most dance studios. Our costumes are mostly re-usable to keep things easier and more cost effective! However, this semester we are doing something a bit different than our normal for this class! Normally we have a white shirt and skirt base to our costumes, with something on top as the rest of the costume. For this performance, however, we will be using red circle skirts, which I will be making and keeping to re-use for future performances and other classes. So, instead of you buying these to keep, I will just need you to pay a \$15 costume fee to help me with the cost of making them. The parts of the costume that you will need to provide, and will be keeping, are the following items:

- Pink ballet shoes
- Light pink (or skin color) dance tights
- White bloomers: if your dancer is new to Set Apart Girls and does not have these from previous performances, we have extra bloomers that you can borrow for the day.
- A long-sleeved white leotard. This you can find online. I order mine from Discount Dance Supply, and I recommend the Theatricals or Capezio Women's Long Sleeve Dance Leotard. I also recommend going with a size larger than your dancer usually wears.

NOTE: Leotards should be considered as under-clothes, and should not be worn around the church without something over it (like a shirt and pants/skirt)! We will be putting dresses on over the leotards for their costume.

HAIRSTYLE- Please pull your dancer's hair back in a secure, neat bun, quite low, near the nape of the neck. So, whatever supplies you need to make a bun, make sure you have those things on hand as well :)

MAKE-UP AND ACCESSORIES- No jewelry please, unless it's very small and discreet (like stud earrings). For make-up, we ask that you use it somewhat moderately, rather than heavy like a stage make-up job. Thank you so much!
